<b>ORGANISATION</b>	<p>B75 is a value-based table tennis club with professional trainers and players. The Work Camp will be a part of our annual International Table Tennis Summer Camp.</p> <p>200 trainers and players from all over the world will gather for three weeks of learning, fun, making new friends and much more. In 2021, the participants came from 43 countries.</p> <p>The International Summer Camp has existed for 17 years. This is the fourth year they are hosting a Work Camp. The first three times have been a success and they are looking forward to this year.</p>
<b>WORK</b>	<p>The different tasks can include assisting in the kitchen, with all practicalities except cooking, and serving the food to the other camp participants.</p> <p>Similar tasks can include helping with cleaning assistance or driving shuttle buses to and from the airport, train station, ferry terminals and practice halls.</p>

	<p>Other tasks can include overseeing activities with the camp participants and the smallest children, helping in the administration with check-in, check out and room preparations and making video reports for international live streaming, writing articles and taking photos for social media.</p> <p>It will also be possible to be a sparring partner in the Table Tennis Camp and interact with the camp participants.</p> <p>As a volunteer, your work week will consist of 5 working days and 2 days off, though these days will be rotating. You might have to work at the weekend, but then you will have time off during the week.</p> <p>Your workday will be no more than 7 hours, and you will be working with local volunteers.</p> <p>Work starts in the morning and the afternoon. Some tasks, like being a part of the video crew, mean you must work at different times during the day.</p> <p>There will be a rotation between the tasks to make the days vary for the volunteers.</p> <p>The camp is good for you, if you like to be in an international environment and can adapt to changes.</p>
<p><b>ACCOMMODATION AND FOOD</b></p>	<p><b>Accommodation:</b> The volunteers will be sleeping in classrooms. There will be mattresses, pillows, and bedding. Please bring your own sleeping bag.</p> <p><b>Food:</b> All Work Camp participants eat in the canteen with all the other participants. Both breakfast, lunch and dinner will be provided by the Work Camp host.</p> <p><b>Bathroom facilities:</b> The bathrooms are next to the classrooms where you will be sleeping. They have washing machines available, which are for free.</p>
<p><b>LOCATION AND LEISURE</b></p>	<p>During your three weeks stay in Northern Jutland you will have time to explore some unique nature and attractions in Denmark.</p> <p>Your Work Camp leaders will help you and the group with organising activities in your spare time. It is free to enjoy the beautiful nature of Northern Jutland, but some activities might require an extra charge. The host will not cover additional charges.</p> <p>The Work Camp will be taking place very close to the beach, so there are good opportunities to go for a swim.</p>

	<p>You can arrange a day trip to Skagen, the most Northern tip of Denmark where two oceans meet. Skagen is famous for the special light which has attracted many painters, cosy yellow and red houses and much more.</p> <p>You can also visit Hjørring, a city less than 15 km from the sea and beautiful sandy beaches. You can also take a day trip to Aalborg, the third biggest city in Denmark.</p> <p>One of the neighbouring towns called Hirtshals is the biggest Aquarium in Northern Europe. And in another neighbouring town is the biggest summer amusement park in Denmark.</p>
<p><b>SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS</b></p>	<p>In regards to COVID-19, it is our ambition to complete our Work Camps this summer, but it is essential for us, that our volunteers feel safe during the time they spend at our camps. This is why we constantly keep ourselves updated on the situation and we follow the Danish government's instructions. Furthermore, we are ready to answer any questions that you might have, and we will keep all our volunteers updated right up until the start of the Work Camp.</p> <p>Your Work Camp host will have guidelines on how to handle COVID-19 during your stay, including how to handle isolation and enforcement of government guidelines.</p> <p>People with an impaired ability to hear or see are more than welcome. Unfortunately, we cannot accept volunteers in wheelchairs.</p> <p>English will be the only language spoken. All participants must be willing to speak English, even though being from the same country or have trouble with the English language. Try your best!</p>
<p><b>TRAVEL INFO</b></p>	<p><b>Nearest airport:</b> Aalborg Airport  <b>Nearest bus/train station:</b> Aalborg Airport</p> <p><b>Meeting point and Time:</b>  Meeting Point: The meeting point will be at Aalborg Airport, where we will pick you up and lead you to the place of accommodation. As the Work Camp is only a short drive, the Camp leaders will drive back and forth from the airport. You might have to wait a little bit if many participants are arriving around the same time.  Arrival Time: 15:00 and 19:00 on July 9th.  Departure Time: 12:00 on July 30th.</p> <p>AIR TRAVEL</p>

	<p>Arrival at Aalborg Airport: To make it to your meeting point in time, your flight must arrive no later than 18:00 on the first camp day. As the airport is the meeting point, there will be no additional cost or travel time.</p> <p>Arrival at Copenhagen Airport: To make it to your meeting point in time, your flight must arrive no later than 12:00 on the first camp day. From the airport, you take a direct train to Aalborg Airport. The train departs every hour. Total travel time from the airport to the meeting point will be approximately 5 hours. The travel cost from the airport to the meeting point is approx. 60€.</p> <p><b>LONG-DISTANCE BUS / TRAIN</b> Arrival at Aalborg bus/train station. To make it to your meeting point in time, your bus/train must arrive no later than 18:00 on the first camp day. From Aalborg St., you take a bus directly to the meeting point. The bus departs every 30 min. Total travel time from Aalborg St. to the meeting point will be approximately 30 min. The travel cost from Aalborg St. to the meeting point is approx. 6€.</p> <p>Further details on travel arrangements and purchasing of train/bus tickets will be provided in your infosheet after acceptance. If you are not able to make it in time to the meeting point, please consider arriving one day early and booking a hostel.</p>
