ORGANISATION	<p>Himmelstorm Festival is a three-day festival set in the idyllic eco-village Dyssekilde. It's a family-friendly festival with over 1.000 people participating. At the festival, you can experience music, dance, theatre, acrobatics, circus, workshops and a whole lot more.</p> <p>The Work Camp will be centred around setting up and building temporary structures for the festival grounds.</p> <p>Dyssekilde is a small village with about 1,000 inhabitants. The village is built on a strong philosophy of ecology and sustainability. Therefore, almost everything in the small community is sustainable and the village even has a small windmill to produce electricity.</p> <p>Himmelstorm Festival has been a non-profit since the beginning, so they really appreciate the work the volunteers do. Each year, approximately 220 volunteers contribute to making Himmelstorm is an experience to remember. At this festival, you will meet many new people and have a great experience.</p>

<p>WORK</p>	<p>At the Work Camp, you will be building the festival in collaboration with other volunteers. Building a festival is hard work, but incredibly fun and rewarding. The tasks will vary from day to day, but mainly manual work to prepare the framework for the festival.</p> <p>We'll be assembling pre-built structures, pitching big top tents, setting up showers and toilets and cooking meals for all the fabulous volunteers preparing the festival grounds for the festival. In addition, you must dismantle the festival structures and clean up when the festival is over.</p> <p>You will have free time during the festival where you can enjoy the good music and cosy atmosphere.</p>
<p>ACCOMMODATION AND FOOD</p>	<p>Accommodation You will all be sleeping in two classrooms in a nearby school. You will have to bring your own pillow, sleeping bag, and mattress.</p> <p>Food: You and the other participants are responsible for making your own breakfast throughout the whole Work Camp. Lunch and dinner are provided on the days of setting up the festival. During the festival, you will receive two meal+drink vouchers each day, that you can use as you wish. In other words, there will be no extra expenses related to meals, unless you are in the mood for snacks, which you will have to pay for yourself After the festival, you and the other participants are responsible for all meals.</p> <p>All expenses are covered by the camp host. There is a local supermarket close to where you live and there will be a primitive kitchen where you will be cooking in teams.</p> <p>Bathroom facilities: Baths and toilets are available at the school and festival site. Unfortunately, there is no washing machine.</p>
<p>LOCATION AND LEISURE</p>	<p>The camp is located in a cosy local area with beaches and forests, so there is plenty of room for a lot of fun outdoor activities. The camp hosts would like to lend the groups some bikes so that you can all enjoy the lovely area together.</p> <p>Your Work Camp leaders will help you and the group with organising activities in your spare time. It is free to enjoy the beautiful nature of</p>

	<p>Hundested, but some activities might require an extra charge. Any additional charges will have to be paid by the volunteers.</p>
<p>SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS</p>	<p>In regards to COVID-19, it is our ambition to complete our Work Camps this summer, but it is essential for us, that our volunteers feel safe during the time they spend at our camps. This is why we constantly keep ourselves updated on the situation and we follow the Danish government's instructions. Furthermore, we are ready to answer any questions that you might have, and we will keep all our volunteers updated right up until the start of the Work Camp.</p> <p>Your Work Camp host will have guidelines on how to handle COVID-19 during your stay, including how to handle isolation and enforcement of government guidelines.</p> <p>For security reasons, we can unfortunately not have volunteers with hearing or sight disabilities. For other physical disabilities, it depends on whether the volunteer can do manual work for several hours since the work is about construction and is very physical.</p> <p>The work will be outside and it is expected that you do have some experience with manual/piratical work. It is also important that you bring practical clothing for all kinds of weather.</p> <p>English will be the only language spoken. All participants must be willing to speak English, even though being from the same country or have trouble with the English language. Try your best!</p>
<p>TRAVEL INFO</p>	<p>Nearest airport: Copenhagen Airport Nearest bus/train station: Dyssekilde Station</p> <p>Meeting point and Time: Meeting Point: Hågendrupvej 9, 3390 Hundested, which is a ten min. walk from Dysselkilde Station. Arrival Time: 15:00 and 18:00 on July 24th. Departure Time: 12:00 on August 1st.</p> <p>AIR TRAVEL Arrival at Copenhagen Airport: To make it to your meeting point in time, your flight must arrive no later than 15:00 on the first camp day. From the airport, you take a train to Copenhagen Central Station. The train departs every 10 min. From there, you will take a train to Hillerød St. This train also departs every 10 min. From Hillerød St., you will take</p>

	<p>a train directly to Dyssekilde Station. The train departs every 30 min. From there, is a short walk to the meeting point. Total travel time from the airport to the meeting point will be approximately 2 hours. The travel cost from the airport to the meeting point is approx. 12 Euro.</p> <p>LONG-DISTANCE BUS / TRAIN Arrival at Copenhagen Central bus/train station. To make it to your meeting point in time, your bus/train must arrive no later than 16:00 on the first camp day. From Copenhagen Central St., you will take a train to Hillerød St. This train also departs every 10 min. From Hillerød St., you will take a train directly to Dyssekilde Station. The train departs every 30 min. From there, is a short walk to the meeting point. Total travel time from Copenhagen Central St. to the meeting point will be approximately 90 min. The travel cost from Copenhagen Central St. to the meeting point is approx. 10 Euro.</p> <p>Further details on travel arrangements and purchasing of train/bus tickets will be provided in your infosheet after acceptance. If you are not able to make it in time to the meeting point, please consider arriving one day early and book a hostel.</p>
